






***Dendrobium* Section *Rhizobium* Hybrids**

4048	D. Kalon Byrne-Dimos x D. Wickersham	50mm @ \$11
	Similar cross to above. However, looking for yellow/green based flowers with pink/purple markings. Again, labellum's should be white and large with pink/red markings. In some cases, I would expect pure yellow flowers with white labellum's.	
4149	D. Tweetas 'Neville' AM/AOC x D. Martin 'Life'	50mm @ \$11
	Very similar to our cross G43. We are looking for colourful yellows with outstanding shape, and red/brown/purple patterning. There's no experimentation with this cross, just on a hunt for award quality progeny.	
4151	D. Granma 'Ruby Lips' x D. caudiculatum 'Cirrocumulus' CBR/ANOS	50mm @ \$11
	We are on the search for yellow flowers, red labellum's, high flower counts, and robust plants that flower multiple times throughout the year.	
4159	D. Wickersham – remake (D. Lauren 'Holly Chief' AM/AOC x D. Australian Ginger 'Wow' HCC-AD)	50mm @ \$11
	A remake of a grex that is highly awardable. Large colourful flowers with good shape. They are fast growers.	
4231	D. Tweetas – remake (D. striolatum 'Phena's Ruffles' AM/AOC x D. Tweetie 'Darkest')	50mm @ \$11
	A remake of a classic hybrid using, in my opinion, better parents. This grex has produced many awards so it is worthwhile growing a few! I would expect mainly brown and yellow flowers with varying colours in the labellum and some marking of the other segments in purple/brown tones.	
4207	D. Wickersham x D. Tamara 'JD Spots'	50mm @ \$11
	Expect a range of flower presentations, from pastel pinks with fine patterning to golden-yellow blooms with striking red and purple markings on the labellum. These will be fairly large flowers and have top shape. Wickersham should help raise the flower count.	

4232	<i>D. Oliver Jack Freckles 'Oliver'</i> x <i>D. Tweetie 'Darkest'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		This cross promises a stunning range of colours, from yellows with subtle red/purple markings to deep, intense burgundy tones with bold markings. A remake of D. Sean Murray.
4195	<i>D. Granma 'Ruby Lips'</i> x <i>D. Australian Lemon Pepper 'Pam 69'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		This cross blends the bold, red labellum of D. Granma 'Ruby Lips' with the spray can effect and high flower count of D. Australian Lemon Pepper 'Pam 69'. Expect a combination of yellow to gold flowers with vibrant red centres and markings on the petals. Plants will be compact and flower several times a year when mature.
4204	<i>D. Dunnlee</i> – remake (<i>D. Australian Ginger 'Wow'</i> HCC-AD/AOC x <i>D. Tamara 'JD Spots'</i>)	50mm @ \$11
		A remake using 'Wow' which has colour plus! These should be large flowers with good shape. Colours will range from brown to yellow with varying amount of oink and purple splashing's through the segments and labellum.
4278	<i>D. Tweetas 'Mustard'</i> AM-AD/AOC x <i>D. Wickersham 'Genesis'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		Looking for gold and yellow flowers of substantial size here on compact plants! Nothing more to it.
4276	<i>D. Wickersham 'Genesis'</i> x <i>D. Hunter Alice</i>	50mm @ \$11
		This cross brings together the best features of two standout parents. D. Wickersham 'Genesis' contributes excellent flower shape and size with subtle earthy tones, while D. Hunter Alice adds vibrant, deep burgundy patterning and bold labellum colouring. Expect blooms with golden to greenish bases, overlaid with striking red and purple markings, and a distinct, colourful labellum.
4255	<i>D. Wickersham</i> x <i>D. Hunter Alice</i>	50mm @ \$11
		Flowers are expected to display a range of hues, from soft pinks to deep burgundy tones, with heavy spotting and a vivid, contrasting labellum. Look for well-formed blooms with vibrant patterns that stand out on the show bench. Plants should have good vigour, producing flowers that open wide and hold well on the spike.
4205	<i>D. Granma 'Ruby Lips'</i> x <i>D. Martin 'Gold'</i> AM/AOC	50mm @ \$11
		This cross promises striking gold-toned blooms with rich red accents. D. Granma 'Ruby Lips' contributes vibrant red labellums while D. Martin enhances the shape, size, and flower count. Expect yellow flowers with excellent presentation and contrasting red markings on the labellum. Plants will be vigorous, capable of producing multiple flushes of flowers throughout the year.

4210	<i>D. Grey Ghost 'Tumbi' AM/AOC x D. Hot Coals</i>	50mm @ \$11
		Expect flowers ranging from soft greys and smoky whites to deep reds and maroons, with unique patterning and contrasts. Exciting cross!

Dendrobium Species

4101	<i>D. spec. var. spec. 'Windermere' x D. spec. var. grandi. 'Rock Pile'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		'Rock Pile' is a dark yellow and is often ranked as one of the best grandi's out there. Here with 'Windermere' we are looking for improvements in presentation and shape, while retaining size and colour.
4098	<i>D. spec. var. spec. 'Windermere' x D. spec. var. grandi. 'Jelita'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		Very similar to the above cross, however, 'Jelita' used here.
4237	<i>D. kingianum 'Dragonette' x 'Black Beauty'</i>	50mm @ \$11
		This cross was made by Justin Lee. These will be show bench kingi's. Expect some darker pinks and some blush colours and mixed pastel pinks.
4127	<i>D. striolatum 'Neville' HCC/ANOS x 'Ruffles' FCC/AOC</i>	50mm @ \$11
		A new cross that aims to restart are line breeding of this species. Brown flowers, red striations, big fluffy white labellum's, and lots of flowers. How could you go wrong!

Zygopetalum

4167 *Zygopabstia Pimpala* x *Zygoneria Kuitpo*

50mm @ \$11



This cross should produce vibrant colours, intricate markings on green bases, and a robust growth habit. The flowers will display a combination of bold purple lips contrasted against green petals with deep burgundy markings.

Sarcochilus hartmannii

4064 *S. hartmannii* 'B.S' HCC/AOC x *S. hartmannii* 'Just Dance'

50mm @ \$11



Dad here will help these seedlings power along while not jeopardizing the above aims of this breeding program. 'Just Dance' is 'Red Snow' x 'Yellow Snow'.

4065 *S. hartmannii* 'B.S' HCC/AOC x self

50mm @ \$15



Well, here we are, people asked so we did it again. This selfing in the past has produced some of the best hartmannii around, including the 'Baby BS' plants used by David Butler. Don't miss out on these as we don't plan on redoing this selfing again!

Tropicool™ *Dendrobium* and *Cool Dendrobium* Hybrids

4102 *D. Mega* 'Magic' x *D. Australian Stardream*

50mm @ \$11



Mega is a beautiful flower, however it does have a low flower count and is a bit of a slower grower. The Australian Stardream I used here has a similar yellow/green base. However, is a fast and easy grower with a high flower count. I am hoping that this injection will beef up the flower count and increase the robustness of the plant, while maintaining the flower shape, size, and substance. I would also expect some red/brown patterning.

4104 *D. Elegant Hazel* x *D. Jazz* 'Windsor Downs'

50mm @ \$11



Jazz WD does amazing things for plant compactness, ease of growth, and flower shape. We may lose some colour saturation here. However, plants will have very shapely flowers. Yellow based flowers, with red/pink patterning over the top.

4106 *D. Elegant Hazel* x *D. Candice* 'Ace'**50mm @ \$11**



Think Bergen, Mem. Alicia, and Tie-Dye. They are some of my favourite hybrids. Star-like stance, broad segments, and easily grown compact plants. Flowers will be large, ranging from white with pink/purple patterning through to red/pinks with some stripes and dots.

4107 *D. Long Thanh* 'Houston' x *D. Candice* 'Ace'**50mm @ \$11**



As I have said earlier Long Thanh needs a higher flower count. Candice has achieved that before with crosses Bergen, Mem. Alicia, and Tie-Dye. I Also think there is a chance that progeny will continue to have that cream/green base colour, with purple patterning overlay.

4108 *D. Long Thanh* 'Houston' x *D. Ray's Dream* 'Spots'**50mm @ \$11**



A mixed bag here. These will be highly colourful orchids that may be a little slow to grow. But when they do, they will be important for the next stages of breeding. Multi-coloured, patterned hybrids expected.

4038 *D. Inquest* x *D. Aussie Victory* 'Supernatural'**50mm @ \$11**



The second inline for cross of the catalogue. Expecting Binh Ba style flowers with good shape and intense pink/purple and fruit salad tones

4014 *D. Saigon Victory* 'Callyn' x *D. spec. var. curv.* 'Daylight Moon' FCC/AOC**50mm @ \$11**








D. Saigon Victory 'Callyn' has this very interesting red/brown colouration. It also has great shape and texture. Here we are searching for dusty reds and browns for the show bench. 'Daylight Moon' will aid in producing plants with great shape, colour, and flower count.

4061 *D. Beast* 'Tumbi' x *D. spec.* 'Triffid'**50mm @ \$11**



These will not lack substance and texture, both parents have tones! Looking for sunset toned pastels, big flowers, and lots of them here.

4222	<i>D. Long Thanh 'Tumbi' x D. Bellambi 'Genesis' HCC/AOC</i>	50mm @ \$11
	Searching for interesting sunset tones here, with lots of shape. These interesting hybrids are my favourite, their ability to flower more than once a year, their shape, and their interesting and unique colour combinations. I think this cross will result in flowers that really stand out amongst a collection of yellows and pinks.	
4224	<i>D. Bellambi 'Genesis' HCC/AOC x D. Kayla 'To The Rescue'</i>	50mm @ \$11
	A continuation of our lines that are aiming to produce compact plants with shapely and substance filled flowers. These will be yellow base colours with varying overlays of red and brown.	
4217	<i>D. Emily de Leon x D. Hunter Titanium 'Jazzy'</i>	50mm @ \$11
	Similar aim to the above cross, however, using Emily here because of its high flower count and vibrant purple markings.	
4228	<i>D. Burgundy Bride 'Claret Ice' x D. Class 'Windsor Downs' AM/AOC</i>	50mm @ \$11
	Looking for floriferous pinks here on upright inflorescences' and on compact plants. I expect these to be fairly consistent and have good shape and size. Could make good specimen displays also.	
4212	<i>D. Candy x D. Sunglow</i>	50mm @ \$11
	This cross was made by Carole Barnett. The intent here is to create sunset toned Tropicool Dendrobiums. Sunglow as a pollen parent has been known to do this before, think D. Bird Cage, Bellambi, Grace Robson etc.
